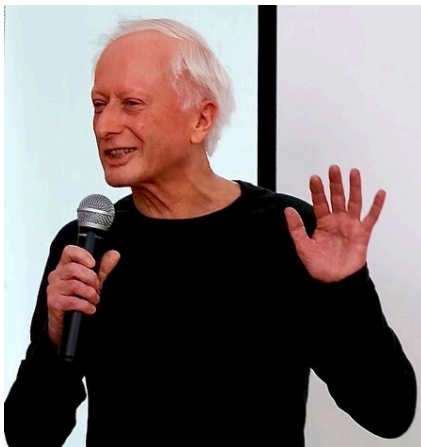

My working life was spent firstly in bookselling and then in university administration, but days off frequently found me rummaging happily in record offices and libraries. "How come I was landed with the name of Bodfish?" is a question I began working on over 40 years ago. Wanting to know "What went on in the past around where I live?" made me a founder member in 1984 of Smethwick Local History Society, of which I am currently chairman. I have taught local history research and palaeography for the University of Birmingham's School of Continuing Studies. Sharing my discoveries via my talks has been a delight to me for over 20 years.

## Interest Group of the Month Jazz Appreciation

Our third group of the month is *Jazz Appreciation* and the following item has been submitted by group leader Carol Miller:

The first Jazz Appreciation group began at the start of the Moseley and Kings Heath U3A and, not long afterwards, as the first group became full, a second group was formed. We meet in each others houses so this limits the numbers, but, although some members have come and gone, we have found that 'small is beautiful' as we get to know each other and discussion is easy. Initially, when we are learning about each other, we introduced ourselves through the jazz we enjoyed, playing and talking about our favourite music. Definitions of jazz are not tightly agreed and the range is enormous. Sometimes our meetings have taken a theme, for example, an artist or an instrument, with one member introducing the theme and leading the discussion. For some months we followed a Jazz timeline, prepared for us by Ted Raybould (the only musician in the group), listening to the earliest recordings of jazz from the 1920s and linking this with world events. We followed developments up to the late 1950's and then paused for a while as that era became so vast and complex with the beginnings of Bepop and so may interesting individuals to listen to - Charlie Parker, Dizzy Gillespie, Dexter Gordon, Mary Lou Williams, Thelonius Monk among the many.

Recently, an exciting development has been our links with the Jazz research group at Birmingham City University. This is actually the largest group of researchers in jazz in the world! That, linked with the Jazz studies degree for musicians at BCU, makes us privileged indeed. Birmingham is a very important jazz hub. Introduced to us by Tony Dudley Evans, nationally a very well respected jazz curator, members of the Jazz research group have come to talk to us about their interests. These include explorations of jazz at the BBC in the 60's, Duke Ellington at the BBC and we are looking forward to the coming months when more talks are planned. For these meetings, the two Jazz Appreciation groups join together. A great plus of the groups is that we often go to gigs together. There are so many in Birmingham with so many talented players. If someone spots something they are interested in, an email goes round, and an outing is arranged.

The Jazz Appreciation groups have really opened up opportunities for us and have given us all a very interesting group of new friends.

It is difficult to show jazz appreciation in a photograph but, be assured, this photo shows members of the group watching the film 'Jazz on a Summers Day' on TV at the house of one of our members.

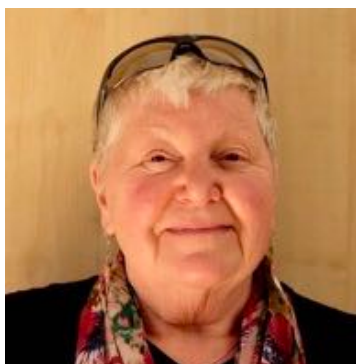
