October Monthly Meeting - the Coffin Works

Speaker, Sarah Hayes

Newman Brothers at The Coffin Works is a museum located on the edge of the Jewellery Quarter at Fleet Street, Birmingham. http://www.coffinworks.org

This grade II* listed factory and its contents tells the story of Newman Brothers, Birmingham's last coffin-furniture factory that operated from its Fleet Street premises for over one hundred years until 1998 when workers laid down their equipment, and walked out of the building for the very last time. Everything, including personal belongings were left behind.

Sarah Hayes will explore the history of Newman Brothers and its journey from a first-class coffin fittings manufactory, making fittings for kings, queens and prime ministers, via a derelict factory building to its current state as Birmingham's latest museum.
