Ofcom Advice for consumers: NHS 'test and trace' scams

On a genuine call, contact tracers will never:

- ask you to dial a premium rate number (for example, those starting 09 or 087);
- ask you to make any form of payment;
- ask for any details about your bank account;
- ask for your social media identities or login details, or those of your contacts;
- ask you for any passwords or PINs, or ask you to set up any passwords or PINs over the phone;
- ask you to purchase a product including a test;
- ask you to download any software to your device or ask you to hand over control of your PC, smartphone or tablet; or
- ask you to access any website that does not belong to the Government or NHS.

If you receive a call from somebody claiming to be from the NHS, and they ask you to do any of these things, hang up and report the call:

• to Action Fraud, by calling <u>0300 123 2040</u> or by visiting its <u>website</u>, if you are in England, Wales or Northern Ireland.

Early one morning I was watching a busy small bird nest building. The water was reflecting a clear bright blue sky, stronger than the sky blue, and focussing my camera on a small bird that seldom looked in my direction took a lot of patience. As I got a sharp image of the coot, I have cropped very close then desaturated the blue water, emphasising the white and black, and composed with the red eye on the third point.

A still evening black mirror with sharp reflections. Original picture aspect ratio 4:3, cropped to letterbox. Otherwise unmodified except for increasing colour saturation on blue/green buoy a bit and reducing distant red buoy to avoid distracting eye from central interest. The Model Boat Club later destroyed the nest !

The Great British Indoor Barbecue

A recipe from Sara Meyer

No matter what the weather, we can beat the system and enjoy a barbecue even if it is indoors. The secret is in the homemade barbecue sauce to coat vegetable kebabs, meat or fish.

For the sauce combine approximately a tablespoon of ketchup, a tablespoon of soy sauce, a teaspoon of mustard and the magic ingredient - half a teaspoon of smoked paprika. You can experiment with adding other ingredients such as brown sauce, chilli, lime juice or chutney depending on your tastes.

Coat your meat, fish or vegetables with the sauce and grill in the oven until cooked. Before using, you may want to set aside some of the sauce in a separate container to serve with the meal as a condiment.

Accompany your barbecued delights with baked potatoes or bread and a fresh salad. To complete your barbecue, make fruity cocktails or mocktails to add to that sense of summer fun.
